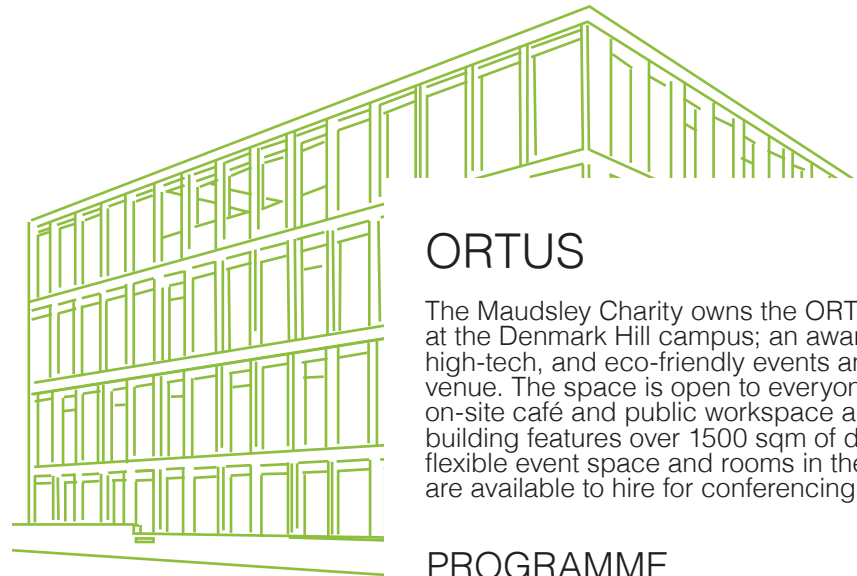
SOUTH LONDON AND MAUDSLEY NHS FOUNDATION TRUST (SLaM)

ADAMSON COLLECTION TRUST

The Adamson Collection is one of the major international collections of art objects made by people who lived in European mental asylums. It holds about 5,500 objects (paintings, drawings, ceramics, sculptures, and works on stone, flint and bone) created between 1946 and 1981, by people at the British long-stay mental hospital, Netherne.

The Collection has been recognised as one of international importance. The Maudsley Charity supported the Adamson Collection Trust to enable a permanent collection of work to be displayed at Oak House, Lambeth Hospital.

PERMANENT EXHIBITION

Explore a selection of objects created by long-stay patients at Netherne Hospital between 1950 and 1981.

The unique display contains over 200 objects previously inaccessible to the public.

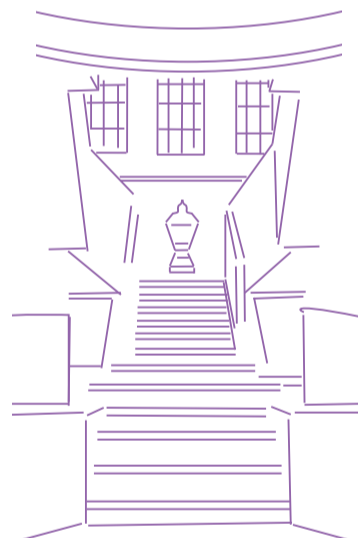
Artists Esther Maxwell-Orumbie and Sarah Carpenter have been working with service users and staff to create lino and mono prints inspired by the ordinary artefacts and occupations of individuals' past and present lives. The exhibition also features written and textiles works, made in occupational therapy sessions on the unit and in the Main Occupational Therapy Department at the hospital.

The Mother and Baby Unit supports and treats women experiencing a wide variety of mental health issues in the perinatal period, including post-natal depression and post-natal psychosis.
